Background / Proposal

The City Planning Division has received an application to amend the Zoning By-law to develop a portion of the lands known as 25 Sewells Road and 182 to 250 Brenyon Way. The proposal seeks permission to construct two 9-storey rental apartment buildings on the part of the site which formerly contained a place of worship. The proposal includes one residential building and one mixed use building for a total of 317 affordable rental units which have secured funding support through the City's Open Door Affordable Housing program. 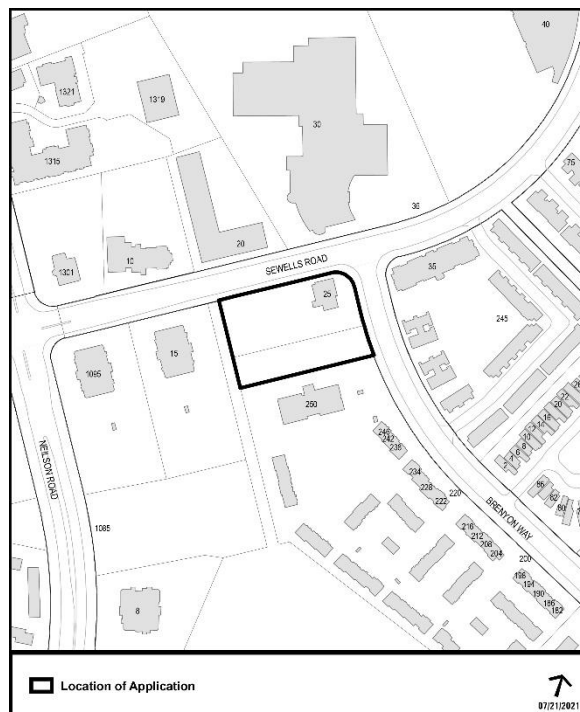
Join us at the Virtual Community Consultation Meeting to participate in a discussion about the proposed development, which will include:
